Order Under Section 144 of the Cr.P.C.

The 31st August, 2020

No. DM/MA/2020/16710.—Whereas, the order u/s 144 of the Cr.P.C. was issued by the office of the undersigned *vide* No. DM/MA/2020/13335, dated 01.07.2020, whereby prohibition on movement of individuals for all non essential activities between 10:00 P.M. to 05:00 A.M. has been imposed in Chandigarh till further order as a measure for containment of COVID-19.

Whereas, the point no. 4 & 5 of the order dated 29.08.2020, issued by the M.H.A. are re-produced hereunder :—

4. State/U.T. Governments shall not impose any local lockdown (State/District/Sub-Division/ City level), outside the Containment Zones, without prior consultation with the Central Government.
5. No restriction on Inter-State and Intra-State movement: There shall be no restriction on Inter-State and Intra-State movement of persons and goods including those for cross land-border trade under Treaties with neighbouring countries. No separate permission/approval/e-permit will be required for such movements.

Whereas, the Chairperson, State Executive Committee of State Disaster Management Authority, U.T., Chandigarh has passed an order dated 31.08.2020 for the strict compliance of the orders dated 29.08.2020, issued by the Chairman, N.E.C. regarding re-opening of more activities in areas outside Containment Zones and to extend the lockdown in Containment Zones up-to 30.09.2020, which are applicable to U.T., Chandigarh.

In view of the order dated 31.08.2020 issued by the Adviser to the Administrator, U.T. Chandigarh and the latest guidelines of the M.H.A., New Delhi, I, K.K. Yadav, I.A.S., District Magistrate, Chandigarh hereby withdraw the above mentioned order w.e.f. 05:00 P.M. of 31.08.2020.

In view of the emergent nature of the order, it is being issued *ex parte* and is addressed to the public in general. This order shall be promulgated by affixing copy thereof at the notice boards of the office of the undersigned and publication in the newspapers having circulation in the area, through the office of the D.P.R., Chandigarh.

Tenure of Board :

The tenure of the Zila Sainik Welfare Board will be for two years.

No. GRIID/Estt./191(i)/2020/1909.—In exercise of the powers conferred by the proviso to Article 309 of the Constitution of India read with the Government of India, Ministry of Home Affairs, Notification No. S.O. 3267, dated 1st November, 1966, the Administrator, Union Territory, Chandigarh is pleased to make the following rules further to amend the Government Rehabilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities (Group C) (Non-Ministerial) Posts Recruitments Rules, 2016 published *vide* No.12/FII(6)2016/3165, dated 01.04.2016 in the official gazette of Chandigarh Administration :—

1. (i) **Short title and commencement.**—These rules may be called the Government Rehabilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities (Group C) (Non-Ministerial) Posts (1st Amendment) Recruitment Rules, 2020.

(ii) They shall come into force on the date of publication in the official gazette.

2. In the schedule appended to the Government Rehabilitation Institute for Intellectual Disabilities (Group C) (Non-Ministerial) Posts Recruitments Rules, 2016 published *vide* No.12/FII(6)2016/3165, dated 01.04.2016 in respect of the post of Special Educator (BMR)/Master/Mistress :—

(a) In Column No. 6 against the post of Special Educator (BMR)/Master/Mistress, the existing entries under the heading "Age limit of direct recruits" shall be substituted as under :—

Between 18 to 37 years,

(Relaxable for departmental candidates in accordance with the instructions issued by the Chandigarh Administration from time to time)

Note:—The crucial date for determining the age limit shall be closing date for receipt of applications from candidates to India, (and not the closing date prescribed for those in Assam, Meghalaya, Arunachal Pradesh, Mizoram, Manipur, Nagaland, Tripura, Sikkim, Ladakh division of J&K State, Lahaul & Spiti district and Pangi sub-division of Chamba district of Himachal Pradesh, Andaman & Nicobar Islands or Lakshadweep).

(b) In Column No. 7 against the post of Special Educator (BMR)/Master/Mistress, the existing entries under the heading "Educational and other qualifications required for Direct recruits" shall be substituted as under :—

(i) Graduate or its equivalent from a recognized University/ Institution with at least 50% marks in aggregate or its equivalent.

(ii) B.Ed in Special Education (Mental Retardation) from a University/ Institution recognized by RCI with at least 50% marks in aggregate or its equivalent.

Or

Any other equivalent qualification approved by RCI in the field of Mental Retardation (Valid Registration with RCI u/s 19 of RCI Act, 1992 is essential)

Required:

Successfully completed ICT training course of duration of time 80 Hours as per instructions issued by the Chandigarh Administration,—*vide* letter No. 28/69-IH(12)Pers. & Trg.-2019/17927, dated 25.11.2019.

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The employees who attain 55 years of age are exempted from the required qualification mentioned above.

Note:—ICT Course is mandatory at entry level as per instructions of Chandigarh Administration *vide* letter dated 25.11.2019.

- (c) In Column No. 8 against the post of Special Educator (BMR)/Master/Mistress, the existing entries under the heading "whether age & educational qualifications prescribed for direct recruits will apply in the case of promotes" shall be substituted as under :—

Educational Qualification: Yes

Age : No

- (d) In Column No. 9 against the post of Special Educator (BMR)/Master/Mistress, the existing entries under the heading "Period of probation, if any" shall be substituted as under :—

(i) No probation in case of promotion.

(ii) Three years in case of direct recruitment.
