In order to curb sale of fake vegan foods, food regulator FSSAI has come out with regulations by defining what constitutes vegan foods and listed out various specifications to be followed for manufacture, sale and import of such food items. Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has come out with the Food Safety and Standards (Vegan Foods) Regulations, 2022. The regulator had brought the draft regulations in September 2021. After considering objections and suggestions received from the public in respect of the draft regulations, the FSSAI has come out with the new regulations.

Mysuru and KSR Bengaluru railway stations certified 'Eat Right Station' by FSSAI

The Food Safety and Standards Authority of India (FSSAI) has certified the Mysuru Railway Station and the Krantiveera Sangoli Rayanna (KSR) Bengaluru Station as 'Eat Right Station' with a 5-star rating. The 'Eat Right Station' certification is awarded by the FSSAI to railway stations that fulfil all criteria to ensure safe and wholesome food is provided to passengers. A station is awarded the certificate after a third-party agency, which is FSSAI-empowered, conducts an audit where ratings from 1 to 5 are given. The FSSAI checks parameters such as compliance with food safety and hygiene, healthy diets, food waste management, promotion of local and seasonal food and promotion and awareness on food safety and healthy diets.

CBIC Releases FAQs On GST Applicability On "Pre-Packaged And Labelled Goods"

The Central Board of Indirect Taxes (CBIC) has released Frequently Asked Questions (FAQs) on the application of Goods and Services Tax (GST) on "pre-packaged and labelled goods. There were several changes relating to GST rates, in pursuance of recommendations made by the GST Council in its 47th meeting, which come into effect from the 18th of July, 2022. One such change is moving from the imposition of GST on specified goods when bearing a registered brand or brand in respect of which an actionable claim or enforceable right in a court is available to the imposition of GST on goods when "pre-packaged and labelled".
