The classification of cities as determined by Government of India, <u>Raipur (UA) and Durg - Bhilai Nagar (UA)</u> fall under areas 'B' in the state of Chhattisgarh. Other area/locations/cities in Chhattisgarh shall be under classification 'C'. Hence the rates of minimum wages shall be applicable accordingly. The rates of minimum wages as revised by Central Government and State Government of Chhattisgarh periodically shall be applicable, whichever is higher. It is requested that revised minimum wages to be strictly complied with.


